

**NORTHEAST AND PARKSIDE HEALTH CENTERS ENSURE THAT JACKSON'S CHILDREN HAVE ACCESS TO MEDICAL AND DENTAL CARE**



In 2005, the Center for Family Health opened Northeast Health Center (NHC), Jackson County's first school based health center. This health center was meticulously planned by active Northeast Parents and staff, Jackson Public School administrators, community leaders and CFH staff. NHC is staffed with a dentist, hygienist and a nurse practitioner. Children can receive well child checks, acute care, and teeth cleanings and treatments.

In the first six months of operation, the NHC served more than 500 children. Parents and staff are very pleased with the center and the services provided.

Because of this intensive planning and the success of the NHC, Jackson Public Schools wrote and received a grant to implement another school based health center. This new school based health center



will be located inside the Middle School at Parkside and will provide complete medical care, including immunizations, physicals and well child checks, risk assessments, acute care, health education, counseling



services and crisis intervention. These services are based on a needs assessment which included information from parents, teachers and students. This health center will be available to all Parkside students, as well as any adolescent between the ages of 12 and 21 in the county.

The Parkside Health Center will be the only health center in the county with a primary focus on adolescents and will be specially designed to meet the needs of adolescents, from service delivery to decor.

Both of these new facilities dramatically increase the access to care for children in our community.

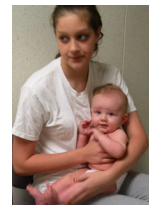

**GIVE KIDS A SMILE DAY AND BABY & TOT DAY EVENTS HIGHLIGHT MEDICAL AND DENTAL NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY**



Spending a day at the dentist's office is not most people's idea of a good time. However, during our Annual Give Kids a Smile Day, which offers free dental screenings and cleanings, hundreds of children gather to see our dentists and receive services. This event has become critical, not only to provide this service but to illustrate to our local, state and federal decision makers the need to ensure that all people have access to dental care.

The Center for Family Health is one of the only dental providers in Jackson County accepting patients with Medicaid or no insurance. More than 20,000 people in our community are uninsured. The Center for Family Health is the only medical and dental provider in our community that people who cannot afford medical care can come to for help.



Baby & Tot Day, an event that provides free immunizations, well child checks, hearing and vision screenings and dental checks for children under the age of five, ensures that basic services for children are available to all people.

The Center for Family Health also hosted a dental day for our diabetic patients. Infections in the mouth can cause insulin levels to change. Diabetics are also more likely to experience more severe dental issues because of their disease.

## WOMEN'S HEALTH CENTER EXPANDS TO FILL NEEDS



Addressing the needs of women and ensuring they have access to preventive

health care is a priority for CFH. Starting in 1991, when our name was the Center for Healthy Beginnings, we have been steadily increasing our efforts to provide basic women's health care, improving access to prenatal health care, improve survival rates among low income women through early and frequent breast cancer screening as well as providing basic support and care.

Jackson County has been ranked as having the 6<sup>th</sup> highest rate of low-birth weight babies and the 13<sup>th</sup> highest rate of pre-term labor in Michigan. Jackson leads the State in both the number of teenage

mothers and the number of adult and teenage mothers who do not receive adequate prenatal care.

The Center for Family Health is committed to improving these numbers. In addition to basic care for women, we have also been very active in the Prenatal Task Force and have helped form a work group to decrease infant mortality and improve the rate of appropriate prenatal care for the women of Jackson County.



As a result we are seeing an increasing number of women. Due to this increase, our OB/Gyn Department needed both more room and more staff. The Women's Center now occupies the lower level of our Sprinport Road facility.

This has been an exciting year! After four years of careful planning, we opened Jackson's first school based health center at Northeast Elementary this past spring. Together with Jackson Public Schools, we have received funding and will open another school based health center at the Middle School at Parkside which will focus on serving adolescents. We hope to begin serving students by the Spring of '06.

We also renovated the lower level of our Medical Facility to accommodate the growing obstetrical and gynecology needs of our community's uninsured women.

Our focus for 2006 centers on increasing the number of adolescents who receive preventive dental and medical care, lowering low birth weight rate and improving the general health of our patients with diabetes.
