



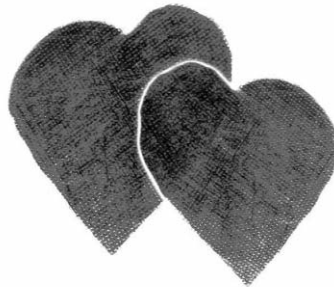

Today I received this note with \$5 from Paige. At the end, Paige wrote, "Every smile gets better." We couldn't agree more. With help from

Paige and many others, 2007 brought us many smiles and "Happy Tails" like those of Betsy and Sam and Sadie on page 2. The following numbers represent the "Happy Tails" that are too numerous to tell here – but stop in and we promise to share one with you!

Highlights:

- We placed almost 1000 cats and dogs with new families.
- Fewer adopted animals were returned than ever before thanks to staff training resulting in better screening and adoption counseling.
- We increased by 300% the number of feral cats that were humanely trapped, spayed or neutered, and then returned to the wild.
- Our volunteer program grew providing the equivalent of almost 6 full time

staff members saving CHS almost \$100,000.

- Our Outreach & Education programs served over 1250 adults and youths.
- There were 1532 visits by low-income families receiving Pet Food Assistance.
- 447 pets were spayed or neutered through our Spay and Neuter Assistance Program.

Our Greatest Challenge:

- Tough economic times mean more homeless animals to serve with fewer resources. We need to improve and secure the financial future of CHS.

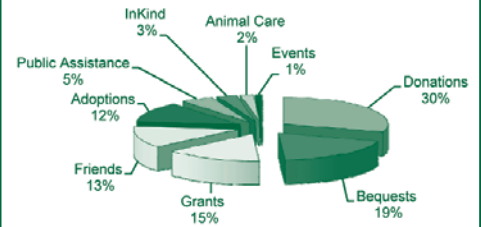

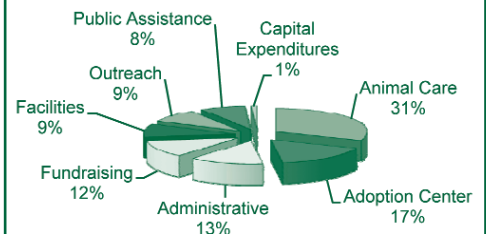
